

DIN Abstract/Abstract Submission Information

DIN serves as a forum for the presentation of epidemiological investigations, clinical case studies, basic and applied research, and other topics in emerging and current zoonotic and environmentally acquired infectious diseases. Abstract topics outside of this realm will not be considered.

Presenters selected for oral presentation will receive complimentary conference registration (single speaker for one 30-minute presentation). The conference can accommodate a limited number of 30-minute presentations with two co-presenters. In these cases, each speaker will receive a 50% registration discount. Poster presenters do not receive discounted registration. Presenters participating in the oral or poster sessions who do not plan to attend the rest of the conference do not need to pay a registration fee.

There is NO virtual option for presentations. You must be able to attend in person if your abstract is accepted for oral or poster presentation.

Abstract Guidelines:

- Capitalize all appropriate words in the title.
- Limit the abstract content to 300 words or less.
- Be clear and concise, providing only a quick overview of your presentation.
- Use a structured format (i.e., background, methods, results, conclusions), but do NOT label the sections.
- Proofread before submitting (check grammar and spelling, italicize species names, etc.).
- Consider seeking feedback from colleagues! Take time to revise and refine your abstract.

To clarify, when completing the Abstract Submission Form, "Presenters" are the individuals that will attend IN PERSON and present (either orally in a specific time slot OR during the poster session). If you want to recognize additional contributors, these individuals will be listed as other authors, not "Co-presenters."
